AAC is used to mean different ways to help someone communicate. It could be simple things like pointing, signing, writing or drawing. It could also be using a computer that 'speaks' words for you.

Evidence Base is when we have looked at something carefully to make sure that it is true. Usually someone will have written a report about it.

The AAC Evidence Base Research Project

We ran a 3 year project with the University of Sheffield, Barnsley Hospital NHS Foundation Trust and Manchester Metropolitan University.

This project collected together all the correct information about AAC.

This correct information can now be used by people to improve services.

It can also help AAC users to campaign for better services.
